

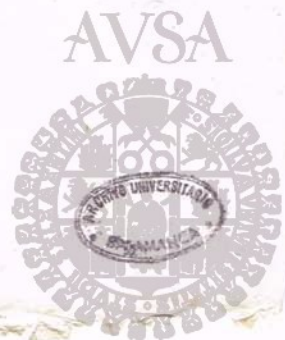
Junta de Censura de 24. de Sept. de 1827
