Pre, (i.e) a Plank laid a-cross a Channel or Gutter to go over, which in other Countries is called a Bridge.

Hatch, (i.e) a Gate in the Roads; and a *half Hatch* is where a Horse may pass, but not a Cart.

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Place, (i.e) the Manour-House.

Gill, (i.e) a little narrow Valley with Wood, and a little *Rill* running in the Bottom.
