HE author of these travels, Mr. Lemuel Gulliver, is my antient and intimate friend; there is likewise some relation between us on the mother's side. About three years ago Mr. Gulliver, growing weary of the concourse of curious people coming to him at his house in Redriff, made a small purchase of land with a convenient house near Newark in Nottinghamsbire, his native country; where he now lives retired, yet in good esteem among his neighbours.

Although Mr. Gulliver was born in Nottinghamfbire, where his father dwelt, yet I have heard him fay, his family came from Oxfordsbire; to confirm which, I have observed in the church-yard at Banbury in that county several tombs and monuments of the Gullivers.
