Dear Mr. Tovar,

Immediately upon my arrival in Baltimore I went to see the Director of the Johns Hopkins Press, and I showed him your book and told him that I considered it a very moving work by a very distinguished scholar and humanist. The Director was impressed, but he has never published a book which had to be translated first. I have the impression that the board would not recommend the publication, and I think that it would be wiser to submit the book either to the Yale University Press (New Haven, Conn.) or to the Harvard University Press (Cambridge 38, Mass.). The Yale University Press published an English translation of Carcopino's *Vie quotidienne*, and actually made money out of it. I should be delighted to send the Yale University Press a letter saying that I personally found the book very interesting, especially the emphasis on the religious background.
